Despite the pouring rain and muddy conditions, there was a lot of excitement from the boys to play against Colgate University. Furthermore, this weekend brought about the highly anticipated return from long-term injury of vice-captain Ollie Corbett ('24) and starting flyhalf Raphael Lansonneur ('25) to an already strong Brown team. This excitement and buzz translated to an 88-0 thrashing of the men from Hamilton, New York leaving the Brown Bears in a good position for their top-of-the-conference-table clash against Fairfield this weekend. A win this weekend would most likely put Brown at the top of their Liberty Conference meaning that Brown could play easier games once the playoffs begin.

Against Colgate University, there were a total of 14 tries scored by 9 different players which shows the complete skillset of the entire team. Special credit must be given to number 8 Antonio Esteves ('25) as he scored a total of five tries this weekend. Esteves' perfect running lines and the underrecognized skill of always being at the right place at the right time was on full display as the Sophomore crashed over the white line five

times. Another impressive display came from the boot of Lansonneur as he converted six out of nine conversions, many of which were all the way from the sideline. Continuing the great scrum success from last week, the Brown forwards dominated Colgate's forwards in set piece. Brown was often rewarded with a penalty from these scrums due to their sheer dominance and elected to kick for touch on many occasions despite the wet conditions. Looking to rectify the lineout troubles that haunted the Brown forwards last week, the forwards put in a strong shift and completed most lineouts with great accuracy despite the difficult conditions. The forwards are definitely looking to keep this trend going as the regular season slowly comes to an end and each game becomes more important.

All of this accumulated to a strong final score of 88-0 to the Bears. The squad looks to keep this momentum going as they go into a tough training week preparing for the away clash against Fairfield this weekend.
